

The eight guiding criteria of the Eurocorps-Foreign Legion concept

- **Additional options in the transatlantic link between the European Union and NATO;**
- **The parity and flexibility of representation for each European Union Member-State in the framework of the European Union Council of Ministers and the Eurocorps;**
- **The alternation of political and operational appointments between the 25 EU Member-States in the EU and Eurocorps framework;**
- **The application of the Petersberg and Helsinki declarations;**
- **The application of voting by qualified majority;**
- **A commensurate evolution to the Single European Currency;**
- **The fostering of a coherent, integrated and effective European Union defence identity;**
- **To support of European Union and United Nations structures;**

The political goals proposed in the conception of the (1/2) macro-organigrams de the Single European Regiment

- the parity of political representation between the twenty-five Member-States** through the alternation of appointments in the framework of the Council of Ministers and the European Union;
- the adoption of voting dispositions by qualified majority at the Council of Ministers** and specific to the deployment of the Single European Regiment in the European Union framework;
- the maintenance of the existing voting dispositions in NATO in the deployment of NATO CJTFs** with national battalions corresponding with the Single European Regiment;
- the adoption of quadrants in voting by qualified majority** and defined by the territorial and maritime frontiers of the European Union (Atlantic, Baltic Sea, Black Sea, Mediterranean);
- the alternation of the political appointments between the EU Member-States** who are represented in the Single European Regiment in the framework of the Council of Ministers and the PSC

The political goals proposed in the conception of the macro-organigrams of the Single European Regiment (2/2)

- **balance between European Union Member-States and in NATO** through alternating the sum of political and operational appointments in both frameworks including the S.E.R.;
- **the unanimity or qualified majority vote of the Eurocorps-Eurofor framework** including the favourable opinion of the Franco-German tandem in all Petersberg scenarios;
- **the unanimity or qualified majority vote by individual European Union(WEU) -NATO quadrants** in the deployment of the S.E.R along the frontiers of the European Union (‘first-stage voting process’);
- **the unanimity or qualified majority vote of the 25 European Union Member-States outside quadrant considerations** in the deployment of the S.E.R. along the frontiers of the European Unions as well as outside the frontiers of the European continent (‘second-stage voting process’);

The military goals proposed in the conception of (1/2) macro-organigrams of the Single European Regiment in the NATO-EU(WEU) framework at the United Nations or OSCE

- **the total flexibility in military representation** by each Member-State of the European Union;
- **the parity of military representation between the twenty-five Member-States** by the alternation of operational appointments in the S.E.R. and the Eurocorps;
- **the alternation of the appointments at the EUMC/EUMS, the Eurocorps, Eurofor or Europol** between the EU Member-States represented in the S.E.R.;
- **the operational balance between the Member-States of the European Union and NATO** by operational appointments including the Single European Regiment;
- **the rapid reaction force (RRF) made available at a moment's notice by the NATO-EU(WEU) framework** at the United Nations Military Committee or at the OSCE;
- **the insertion of individual platoons, companies and battalions of the S.E.R. in the framework of the Europol-IPTF of the OSCE or Europol-CivPol of the United Nations** to limit the political risks in specific scenarios (protection of humanitarian action by NGOs and of populations in situation of distress);

The military goals proposed in the conception of (2/2) the macro-organigrams of the Single European Regiment and its links with the French Foreign Legion

- the balance of the representation of the regiments of the French Foreign Legion in the Single European Regiment (S.E.R.);**
- the establishment of operational correspondances between national regiments and the companies of the S.E.R.;**
- the maintenance of operational coherence between the French Foreign Legion and the Single European Regiment;**
- the adoption of the 2:1 ratio between non-francophone and French-origin legionnaires in the sum of junior NCO ranks with the exception of the Command and Services company (CCS);**
- the adoption of the 2:1 or 3:2 ratio between non-French and French senior NCOs in the numbered and fire support companies of the S.E.R.;**
- the adoption of the 2:1 ratio in the sum of non-French and French officers at the regimental echelon of the S.E.R.;**
